Homework involving digital technology typically has greater impact than non-digital homework. Online homework widens the scope of activities that simply can not be done through paper activity.

Evidence suggests that short focused tasks or activities which relate directly to what is being taught, and which are built upon in school, are likely to be more effective than regular daily homework.



The impact of homework

Creating a regular routine can encourage good homework habits, but be cautious about promoting direct parental assistance. Parents can support their children by encouraging them to set goals, plan and manage their time and emotions. This type of support can help children to regulate their own learning, and will often be more valuable than direct help.

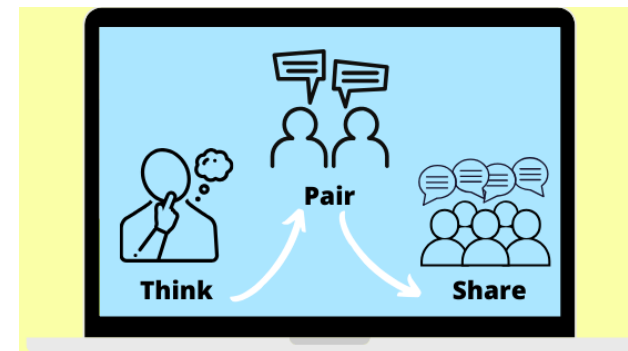
