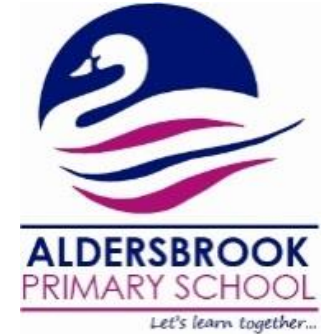


# Aldersbrook Primary School Pupil Premium Action Plan 2018/19



In 2012/13 the government launched its Pupil Premium funding. This money is sent to schools based on the number of pupils in the school who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), Looked After Children, Adopted Children and any pupils from the Forces Families. From 2012/13, it has expanded to include all pupils who have been eligible for FSM within the last 6 years.

This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

For the Academic Year 2018/19, our Pupil Premium Allocation is **£123,600**

We have identified some of the main barriers to learning for our Pupil Premium children to be:

- + Aspirations within education
- + Home support – bridging the gap between parents-pupils-teachers
- + Resources
- + Enrichment experiences

Set out below is how we aim to overcome and monitor these barriers. We will continue with successful measures from previous years as well as introducing new schemes. Our focus this year is to ensure a robust structure is in place to increase parental engagement through the promotion of the Pupil Premium fund available to eligible families, in addition to supporting pupils with regular feedback and updates on progress to their parents/carers.

The Pupil Premium strategy will have termly updates from teachers with an annual review, following the results and impact of this year's initiatives, in June 2019. All initiatives have been devised in support of the School Development Priorities in consultation with school staff and senior leaders.

Pupil Premium Parent Consultation Group	Continued	To bridge the gap between home and school. Meet with parents to discuss how the school supports children in their learning and plans in provision for enrichment and to raise attainment and progress. Training to be provided by external agencies to parents to support them with children at home and with their learning.	SLT	
Pupil Premium Plus Parent Consultation Group	Continued	Runs alongside the PP Parent Groups, but includes additional support and guidance from relevant agencies, including PAC UK.	SLT	
Parent Support Classes	Continued	To target parents to attend parent classes for support in basic skills in English and Maths. Organised by Parent Support Advisor with support from English and Maths Subject Leaders.	SLT	
Pupil Premium Parent Meetings	New	These are additional meetings outside of Parents Evening or Pupil Conference Day. To be organised by class teachers to update half-termly in Pupil Premium child's progress. This should ensure progress is discussed on a more regular basis.	SLT Class Teachers	
One to One Tuition	Continued	Identified pupils, including PP+, will benefit from additional hours of tuition from school staff to improve progress in Reading, Writing, Maths or Phonics.	SLT SEN Class Teachers	

Educational Visits and Residential opportunities	Continued	To build pupils resilience at being away from home and experiencing new opportunities and cultures. This includes subsidised educational visits, as well as additional visits for Pupil Premium children. The link with China continues with all PP Children in Year 5 having the opportunity to travel there in October 2018.	SLT Class Teachers	
Forest School	New	A development from 2017/18, Aldersbrook Forest School will ensure that throughout the year PP children attend Forest School. The aim is to build social and kinaesthetic skills in a rural setting – giving additional learning opportunities outside of the classroom.	Class Teachers	
Green Fingers Club	Continued	Using the school allotment, designated staff members take a group of children outdoors to experience growing and harvesting their own fruit and vegetables all year round. To improve social skills, fine and gross motor skills and teamwork outside of the classroom.	Class Teachers	
Music Tuition	New	Opportunity has become available to extend music lessons, giving PP children free access to expert tuition on site. This covers, but is not exclusive to: violin, piano, cello, guitar lesson.	SLT	
Subsidised Afterschool Clubs	New	To ensure Pupil premium children gain access to a wider spectrum of academic and non-academic afterschool clubs. Clubs run by school staff will be free of charge for PP children. Subsidised fees will be given to externally run clubs such as karate and gymnastics.	SLT	
Subsidised Breakfast Club	New	To allow parents to drop off children earlier to school to ensure a) children are in on time and b) parents can go to work earlier. The cost is to be subsidised from the usual £3 per day.	SLT	

Subsidised Uniform Vouchers	New	For all newly recognised PP pupils, and new PP intake, funds will be made available to assist with the cost of school uniform and PE kit.	SLT	
School Starter Pack	New	For all newly recognised PP pupils, and new PP intake, resources will be made available in a starter pack to include: a dictionary, PE bag, Maths resources, Reading books.	SLT	
Parent Support Advisor	Continued	To support families in ensuring they attend every day and are punctual in order to fulfil their entitlement to learning.	HT	
HLTA Intervention Groups	Continued	To help pupils reach their full potential in Maths and English by working in smaller target groups identified by class teachers and SLT.	LT Class Teachers	
LSA Intervention Groups	Continued	To provide additional support for pupils. To run interventions to narrow the gap of vulnerable pupils, e.g. Toe by Toe interventions.	LT Class Teachers	
SLT in-class Support	Continued	To provide additional support for pupils to make expected and more than expected progress. Team teach with teachers to support learning in class and allow children to make progress in core subjects. Provide planning support for individuals and targeted groups.	SLT Class Teachers	
Class Teacher Assembly Groups	Continued	To reduce the attainment gap of FSM and Pupil Premium pupils in Reading, Writing and Maths. To provide early intervention in KS1. To support target groups in upper KS2 in Maths and Reading.	Class Teachers LT	

Enigma Club	Continued	To provide additional support for pupils who are exceeding their year group expectations, including gifted and talented pupils. Enigma Club focuses on abstract concepts and lateral thinking in order to problem solve and complete tasks.	Class Teachers LT	
Soft Start	Continued	Ensure children are in school on time, with a smooth and productive start to the day. This 20 minute session is also designed to give access to pupils who cannot access online materials at home, including Lexia, ReadingWise and MyMaths.	Class Teachers SLT	
Subject Leader Pupil Premium Pledge	New	All subject leaders will organise additional support for Pupil Premium children. This will allow a wider spectrum, of opportunities to be made available to pupils in areas of the curriculum which may not have been previously accessed. This can include additional educational visits, afterschool clubs or parental support which is targeted directly at PP pupils.	SLT  Subject Leaders	
Phase Leader/SLT Monitoring	Continued	Monitoring of books, pupil progress and attainment specifically for PP children. Ensuring non-negotiables are followed to create and continue additional in-class support for PP pupils to close attainment and progress gaps over time.
