This term, we will be learning:

- History: Events leading up to and during WWII including the Home Front evacuation, women's changing roles and propaganda.
- Geography: Sustainable and non-sustainable solutions for the modern world.
- Art: Making sculptures inspired by Andy Goldsworthy.
- **D&T:** Embroidery Learning different types of stiches and sewing a button.
- **Computing:** 3D modelling using a computer programme and creating a web page on Google Sites.
- PSHE: Learning about identity, society, equality and managing risk.
- Music: Reading and writing music using stave notation.
- **PE:** Dance, gymnastics and cricket.
- French: Speaking in the past tense and reading a French story.
- RE: What will make our city/town a more respectful place?

We will be writing:

 Narratives, formal persuasive letters and an information text.

SPAG:

- Alongside daily SPAG lessons, children are encouraged to use their CGP revision guides to revise all areas from Year 3-6.
- Over the term we will complete three practice SATs papers.

Maths

- We will continue practising
 how to use formal written methods for
 the four operations.
- We will learn about equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages
- We will be learning how to calculate the area, perimeter and volume of 2D and 3D shapes.
- We will be learning to identify the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
- Over the term we will complete three practice SATs papers.

Science

- We will learn about living things and their habitats (classification).
- We will also learn about evolution, inheritance and adaptation.
- We will continue to work scientifically by participating in a range of experiments.
