INVOLVED



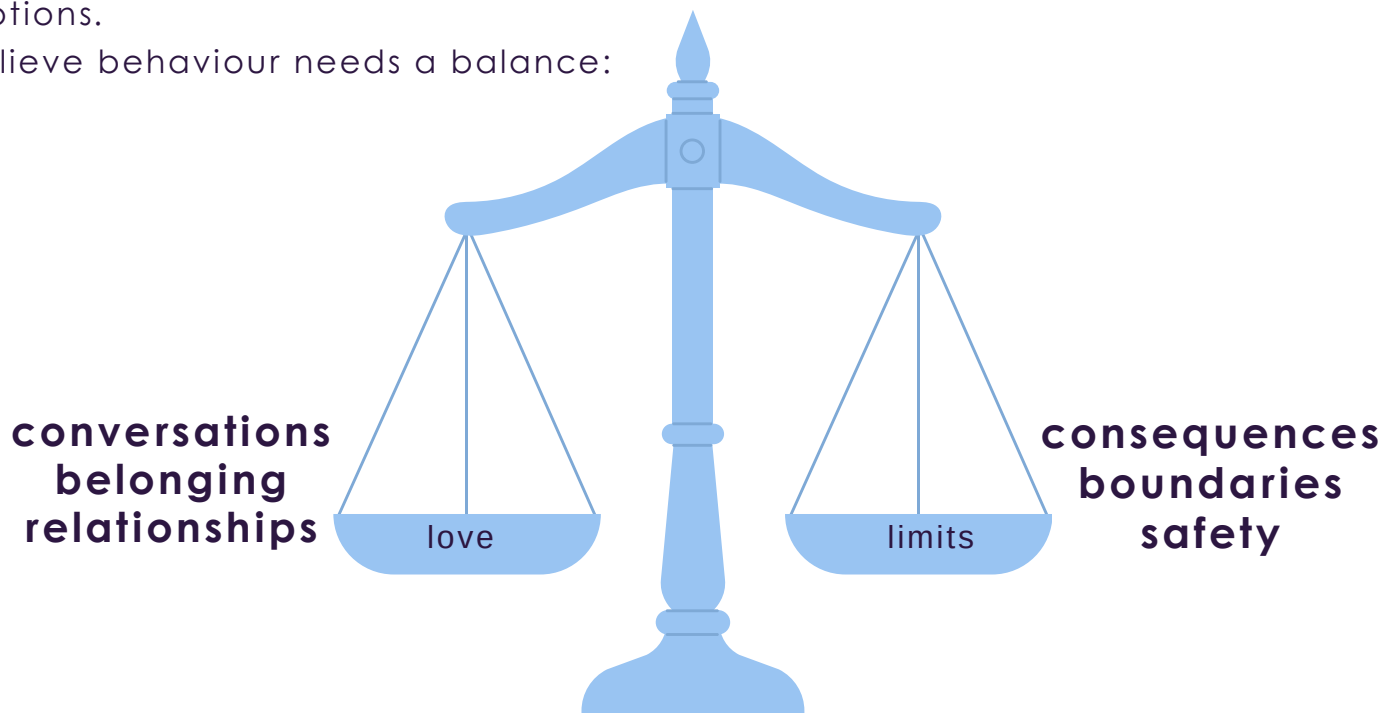
A year 6 pupil suggested that we had some mirrors in the KS2 toilets. She helped to put them up this week!

At Aldersbrook the majority of children behave with consistently high levels of respect for each other. They demonstrate extremely good learning behaviours in the classroom that enable them to learn and progress.

At Aldersbrook our school rules are based on being ready, respectful and safe. Our children know and understand this, and talk about what this means during the day. At Aldersbrook we want a positive environment where bullying is not tolerated, children demonstrate high levels of self-control and where we celebrate and value difference.

We recognise that children are still learning how to behave, how to respond to disagreements, how to play fairly or how to be brave. We also recognise that behaviour is a form of communication and can reflect anxieties and other big emotions.

I believe behaviour needs a balance:



I want every child at Aldersbrook to feel that they belong and to develop positive relationships. Additionally every child has a right to feel safe and secure. As a school we must have clear boundaries and consistent consequences and ensure learning in difficult behaviour situations occur so they are not repeated.

From now on, In line with the school's behaviour policy (see website), children who behave in the following unacceptable behaviours will be sent straight to Mrs Crouch or Mrs McDermott. We will inform parent/carers and may invite you in for further discussions. These may lead to the school accessing external support and/or deciding on a range of consequences. These behaviours include, but are not limited to: violence, (physical contact made with the intention to harm), defiance/rudeness to adults, behaviours or comments that are racist, sexist, or homophobic, bullying behaviour, stealing, spitting.

Our response will take into consideration individual children's needs as well as the context of the situation.

I want every child to feel happy and safe at Aldersbrook and I am sure you will support us in our response to these behaviours.

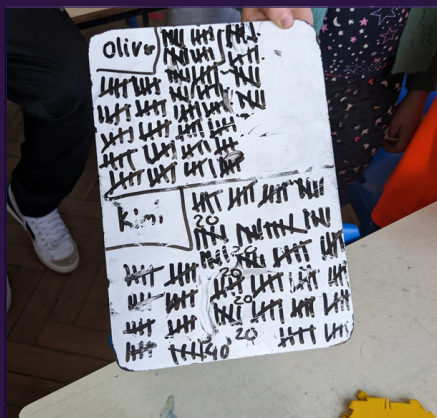

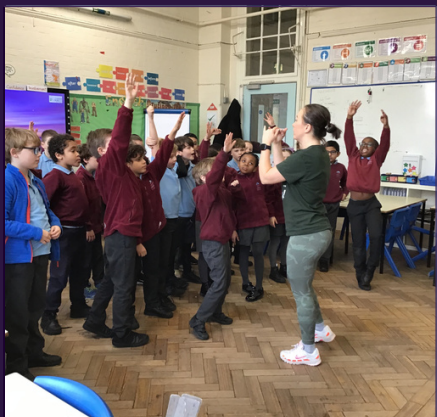
